



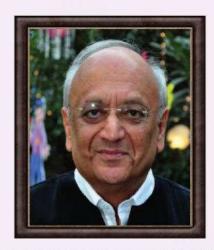

ABOUT KIWANIS



Kiwanis Club of New Delhi (KCND)

is a non-profit charitable organization based in New Delhi to provide artificial limbs free of cost to the needy who had given up the hope of leading healthy lives. Founded in 1978 with Shri Dharma Vira, ICS as President and its founder members included Shri L P Gupta, Dr. Charat Ram, Dr. K K Modi and Dr. Bhai Mohan Singh amongst others. Shri Ram Kumar Jajodia has been the prime mover of the Kiwanis movement in India and it was on his initiative that the Club was formed and the Charter Certificate presented to the Club by then President of Kiwanis International.

Kiwanis Bhawan was inaugurated by the then President of India, Hon'ble Shri K.R. Narayanan on 23rd December 2000. KCND started its charitable work by adopting a backward village called Meoka in Gurugram district with an aim of improving the quality of life of its residents. Initially, the idea was to house only the Artificial Limbs Centre (ALC), but as the resources position and the admin-ability become apparent, several facilities were added. The Club always encouraged diversification and as a first step, a ladies club in the name of Kiwanis Club of New Delhi (L) was established.

Then, Physiotherapy Cum Pain Clinic was set up and thereafter Cerebral Palsy Centre (CPC) WAS ADDED. The club has been active in upgrading the current portfolio of services which it offers free of cost and now it's looking for uplifting it to a State-of-the-art Institution.

KCND was chartered as an affiliated club of Kiwanis International, USA on 4th August 1978 and the charter Certificate was presented to the club by then President of Kiwanis International.



Kiwanis International, which is the Parent Bod of KCND, is a global community of club members and partners dedicated to improving the lives of children one community at a time. It is one of the first service clubs established in the United States and is regarded as one of "the big three" service clubs. Kiwanis along with the International Association of Lions Clubs and Rotary International make up 90 percent of the total service club memberships.

Kiwanis enables the community to actively and easily participate in civic service events and volunteering while engaging with others on a global scale. Because the clubs are mostly comprised of business personnel, Kiwanis encourages networking while also strengthening the communities where the businesses are located. Currently 550,000 Kiwanians in more than 80 countries hosting nearly 150,000 service projects each year. Kiwanis is especially active in the community and local efforts in identifying and catering to important needs. Kiwanis members devote more than 19 million hours of service and raise almost \$100 million every year for their communities.

Kiwanis International has provided community services such as building all-access playgrounds, creating food pantries, hosting diversity fair and many more. It is headquartered in Indianapolis, Indiana, United States and is comprised of different types of clubs to meet the needs of a diverse world. These Club types were created to attract potential members who share common lifestyle and to offer service opportunities to more people.

To treat the users of our services with respect and offer a pleasing and courteous environment.

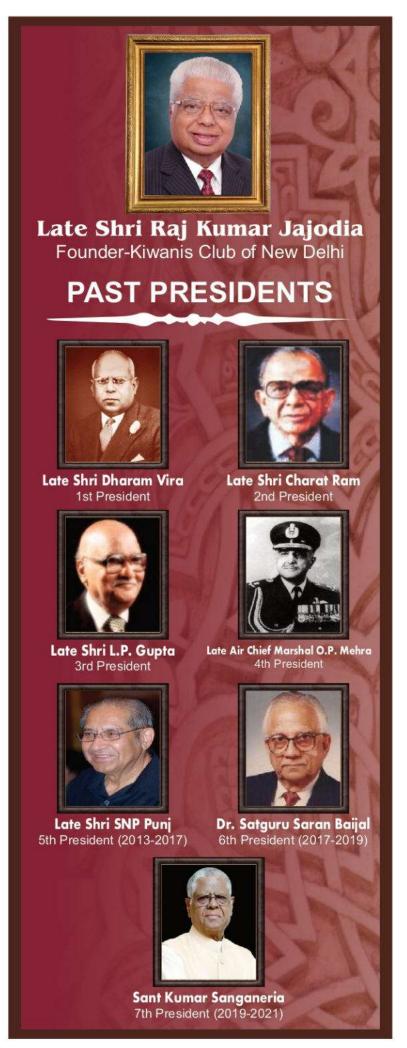

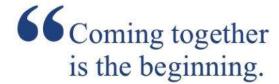
Happiness Doesn't Result From What We Get, But From What We Give.....!!

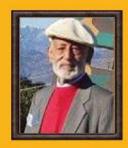

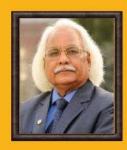

ARTIFICIAL LIMB CENTRE (ALC) -

Artificial limb Centre in Kiwanis' first started its project in Delhi in 1999. It was setup with the primary objective of providing mobility aids e.g. Prosthesis & Orthosis appliances and Polio Callipers to differently-abled.

The main aim is to provide high quality and comfortable artificial limbs tailored to the individual need of every patients, free. For technical support the club entered in a collaboration with Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO), Kanpur, which was appointed as our consultant for providing inputs pertaining to



technology and manufacturing and now it's collaborated with Voice of Differently Abled (VODA) USA.

The Kiwanis Club New Delhi has been engaged in its core activity of providing artificial limbs to physically challenged individuals. On an average, the Centre provides artificial limbs to over 200 patients per month, thus helping them to regain mobility and self-reliance. The Kiwanis Club has also set up satellite artificial limbs centres at Gurugram and NDRS in Collaboration Chikitsa Dispensary.









PHYSIOTHERAPY PAIN MANAGEMENT AND REHABILITATION CENTRE

Kiwanis club of New Delhi is running a department of physiotherapy to provide the required treatment. The department of Physiotherapy was established on the occasion of the Kiwanis club of New Delhi in collaboration with Help Age India.

The physiotherapy cum pain clinic was inaugurated by Smt. Sheila Dixit, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi on 30th September, 2003.

KCND inaugurated its New upgraded Physiotherapy, Pain Management & Rehabilitation Centre at Kiwanis Bhawan on 16th February 2022 with upgraded machines



and new equipment to restore, maintain, and make the most of a patient's mobility, function, and well-being also it helps through physical rehabilitation, injury prevention, and health and fitness. The centre was sponsored by the Past President Sant Kumar Sanganeria.







CEREBRAL PALSY CENTRE



Cerebral Palsy Centre, established at Kiwanis Bhawan, provides care and treatment for individuals affected by Cerebral Palsy (CP). It is a non-progressive neurological disorder which affects movements, speech, posture and other basic functions. CP is caused by brain and nervous system damage, sustained before birth, during labour or shortly after childbirth. Depending upon the area and the extent of the damage, symptoms may include spasms, gait abnormalities, seizures and poor muscle tone. Eyesight, hearing, speech and intellect may also be affected. Most of causes of CP do not have specific curative treatment. However, children suffering from CP present many medical problems that can be treated/ prevented. The initial stage of treatment involves examination by an interdisciplinary team of doctors e.g. Pediatrician, Neurologist, Psychologist, Orthopaedic Surgeon, Speech Therapist and Occupational Therapist. Presently the CP Centre at Kiwanis Bhawan attends to an average of 260 cases per month. The Kiwanis club of New Delhi has two specialist doctors for the same.

We have at present a Pediatrician / Neurologist, Occupational Therapist, Speech Therapist and Special Educator at Kiwanis Bhawan. However, we have made arrangements for our CP patients to be examined by the required specialist at other hospitals/centres. The Kiwanis club also provides training to parents/care takers who are made to understand and treat the specific requirements of their wards.

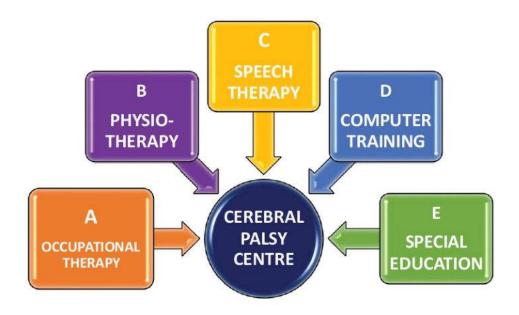




Physical therapy is often the first step in treating cerebral palsy. It can help improve motor skills and can prevent movement problems from getting worse over time. Physical therapy implements strength and flexibility exercises,

heat treatment and special equipment to give children with cerebral palsy more independence.

DEPARTMENT IN CP CENTRE



OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY



Occupational therapy is the use of assessment and intervention to develop, recover or maintain the meaningful activities or occupations of individuals, groups or communities. KCND has a special set-up for occupational therapy which is especially dedicated to the Cerebral Palsy kids. It is one of the most effective therapy for CP kids.

SPEECH THERAPY

Speech therapy is an intervention service that focuses on improving a child speech and abilities to understand and express language, including nonverbal language. KCND has a good setup of speech therapy and we have a speech specialist who provides day to day therapy activities to the kids and the needy people. Anybody can come and get this service at Kiwanis free of charge.

SENSORY INTEGRATION



Sensory Integration is the process by which we receive information through our sense, organize this information and use it to participate in everyday activities. An example of sensory integration is a body smelling food as they bring it to their mouth, testing the food, feeling the texture etc.

VIDEO GAMES EXERCISE



Fitness game, exergaming or gamercising is a term used for video games that are also a form of exercise. We use this technique to create interest in CP kids for exercise and body movement or reaction. Exergames are seen as evolving from technology changes aimed at making video games more fun. We use automatic gaming software which any kid can play with the movement of their hands or other body parts.

COMPUTER TRAINING



We provide basic computer education to Cerebral Palsy kids to improve their learning skills. They learn rhymes, math, identify the colour, numbers and small activities.

SMILE MUDRAS THERAPY SESSION AT KIWANIS



Mudras are hands gesture used to purify and direct the flow of prana (healing life force energy by using fingers). Because each fingers represent a natural element like EARTH, WATER, FIRE, WIND & SPACE. Holding the hand in different shapes draws pressure and awareness to head the meridians cross and intersect. Essentially it's like for your hands. Smile Mudra Meditation project was introduced at Kiwanis as a pilot project with ten special

children. They underwent 7 sessions each interspersed with a few short conference calls as a follow up over a period of one month. Each child was assigned three healers who took extensive history of the child as well as the parents right from conception stage, to ascertain the root or origin of the problem. In continuation of the ongoing Smile Mudra sessions, KCND had organized a review meeting at centre on 26 July 2022. This meeting was to reflect on the performance of patients and how they benefitted from Smile Mudra sessions. Apart from the benefits, the meeting also addressed the problems faced by parents during the session. Furthermore, the main objective behind the meeting was to motivate parents to find best results by continuing these sessions. Views of most of the parents were positive regarding the same.





SUCCESS STORIES

ANANT TEJAS



Anant Tejas (K-3386), is a 2 year old CP patient with right Hemiperasis. He approached Kiwanis one year ago with a condition of partial neck hold, no sitting, no crawling, impaired fine motor, no speech and so on. Our CP team accepted his case with great pleasure. They invested all their technical know-how to improve Anant's condition. As a result, his condition improved miraculously. He is able to hold his neck perfectly, sits comfortably, stands and walks with support and has improved fine motor. He is also able to pronounce

some unclear sounds. Anant's parents paused his therapy during COVID, but they join resumed his therapy sessions at KCND and confirmed that they will not stop Anant's therapy till the time he doesn't recover fully. Thanks Kiwanis to work for such a wonderful cause at no cost.

RACHIT



Rachit, a 3-years old (K 6819) Cerebral Palsy patient visited Kiwanis only two months ago. He showed symptoms which included no sitting, no speech, less socialization and weakness in left hand due to which he was unable to grip objects. However, with sincere efforts of our dedicated CP team including doctors and OT, PT and Speech experts brought forth visible results within two months. Let's not forget to credit his mother who stays at her parents' house for the

sake of Rachit's betterment. Thanks to KCND's management to provide a platform where we all can contribute towards such a noble cause.

VOLUNTEERS PROGRAMME

As of now total 18 no. of interns are have been engaged with us in which 3 no. of interns have completed their internship with Kiwanis.

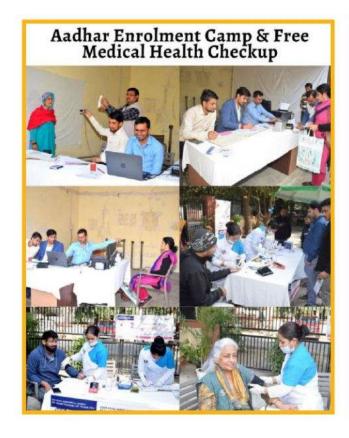




GLIMPSES OF CELEBRATION ON INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Every child deserves better health, love & care

Bhumika is a very bright girl in her late teens. 'She is very lively and loves to enjoy each moment in life to its fullest', says her parents. She has dreams of making it big in life and was determined to work her way toward them. However, her parents could not predict how a single wrong step would wreak havoc in their as well as their child's lives. Bhumika is a free-spirited human who would not stop at anything to achieve success in life. More often than not her free-spiritedness would transform into rebellion.

One day, Bhumika's mother confiscated her mobile phone to reduce her screen time. In a fit of rage, the girl took the unfortunate decision of committing suicide but failed. The attempt has left her disabled due to the lack of oxygen supply to her brain—all her dreams were shattered within a matter of time. Her father died after seeing her situation after few months of this incident.



Bhumika's mother earn their livelihood by running a small paratha shop, however, it is barely enough to make ends meet. Meeting her treatment cost is a far-fetched possibility for them. So, they came to Kiwanis with great hopes for their child's treatment. Our experts made the history and counsel her mother and referred her to team the physiotherapist and occupation therapist to do passive exercises and then she met our counsellor Mrs. Veena Oberoi to make her comfortable. She is also been consulted with ALC team to provide assistive/supporting devices. Her treatment and rehabilitation process have started at Kiwanis with the advice of concerned doctor.

However, with their humble means of income, it's very difficult for Bhumika's parents to be able to afford the costs of commuting daily to our rehabilitation centre for free therapy sessions. The commuting costs are bone-breaking for her parents and render them helpless.

Just like Bhumika, there are several other patients whose socio-economic conditions force them to quit their treatment halfway through. However, we at Kiwanis always believe that each human deserves a second chance in life irrespective of their status.

KCND have adopted this child by providing all available medical facility at centre and taking care of her all medical expenses.

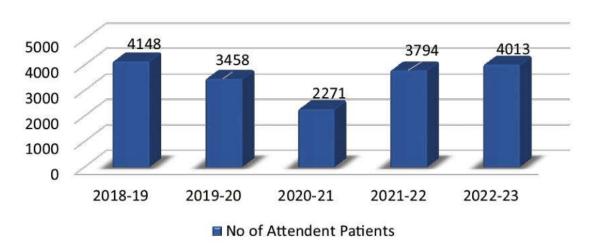

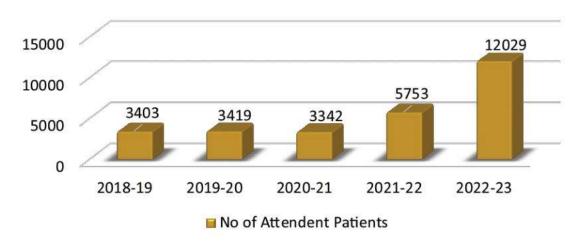

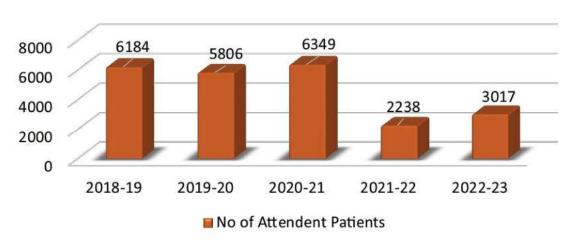
