Kiwanis International

Kiwanis International was founded in 1915 in Detroit, Michigan, U.S.A. The name Kiwanis was selected by the organization's founders based on their understanding that the word was translatable to "we build" from the Algonquian Native American language family.

Initially focused on business networking, Kiwanis changed its focus to service in 1919 — specifically service to children. Over the years, more clubs were created and worldwide expansion of Kiwanis was ultimately approved in the 1960s. Today, there are Kiwanis clubs functioning in nearly 80 countries.



From The President's Desk



Dear Members and Friends,

I have the honour to present the Annual Report of the Kiwanis Club of New Delhi (KCND) for the preceding twelve months, during which KCND has continued to grow smoothly. Over the past year our Artificial Limbs Centre provided 2,705 beneficiaries with prosthesis and orthotic aids, besides repairing such aids for 763 beneficiaries. In cooperation with the Indian Army, we have since 2012 given a special focus to providing artificial limbs to civilians in Jammu and Kashmir. Last September, we extended this and provided aids to 207 beneficiaries in Rajasthan. This year we held six artificial limbs distribution camps across Jammu and Kashmir.

We have been providing occupational therapy, speech therapy, sensory integration, video games exercises, and Smile Mudra therapy, to children with Cerebral Palsy (CP). Over the past year 2,785 children with CP benefitted from our services. We also gave developmental aides and appliances to 1,107 such children, and organized public awareness programs about CP. Our Physiotherapy, Pain Management and Rehabilitation Centre inaugurated in 2022 has fast grown in popularity. Over the past year 3,083 persons availed of its services in 15,154 sittings.

Several new projects have also been implemented over the past year. We initiated a training program for blind girls looking to improve their physiotherapy & occupational therapy skills. In cooperation with a start-up, Life and Limb Pvt Ltd, we are testing myoelectric hands for improved accessibility and would very shortly be fitting them to 4 beneficiaries.

We are now implementing the second phase of our solar panels project for Kiwanis Bhawan and are grateful to Sakata INX (India) Pvt Ltd for funding it. To comply with clean air requirements, we have installed a gas generator for power backup, and disposed off our old diesel genset. Such measures further reduce our carbon footprint and provide significant savings to KCND.

While all other services are free, the Board of Directors approved a token charge for our physiotherapy services, given rising demand and to cover costs. This has generated a monthly inflow of Rs 1.5 lakhs since 1/3/2024. Moreover, in December 2023/January 2024, the remaining two of the three available floors at Kiwanis Bhawan were put on rent. These steps have enhanced revenue accretion, enabling us to extend new and better services to the needy.

KCND was honoured to host Kiwanis International President Lee Kuan Yong on 17/8/2024. Looking ahead, we would project the work being done by KCND while commemorating CP Day (October 2024), International Prosthetics and Orthotics Day (November 2024) and International Day of Persons with Disabilities (December 2024). I urge Members to attend these events.

Finally, my gratitude to the Board of Directors and all Members for their guidance and support, as also to every KCND staff for their devoted efforts in furthering our humanitarian goals.

Kiwanis Club of New Delhi (KCND) is a non-profit charitable organization based in New Delhi to help the needy lead healthier lives. Shri Raj Kumar Jajodia was the prime mover of the Kiwanis movement in India and it was on his initiative that the Club was formed and the Charter Certificate presented to the Club by the President of Kiwanis International.

Founded in 1978 with Shri Dharma Vira as its President, its founder members included Shri L P Gupta, Dr. Charat Ram, Dr. K K Modi and Dr. Bhai Mohan Singh. KCND was chartered as an affiliated club of Kiwanis International, USA on 4th August 1978.

Kiwanis Bhawan was inaugurated by the President of India, Shri K.R.Narayanan, on 23rd December 2000.

KCND operates a charitable medical center in New Delhi that serves individuals with various disabilities. The center has three primary departments: the Artificial Limb Center, the Cerebral Palsy Center, and the Physiotherapy Pain Management and Rehabilitation Center.





Artificial limb Centre in Kiwanis' first started its project in Delhi in 1999. It was setup with the primary objective of providing mobility aids e.g. Prosthesis & Orthosis appliances and Polio Callipers to differently-abled.

The main aim is to provide high quality and comfortable artificial limbs tailored to the individual need of every patients, free. For technical support the club initially entered in a collaboration with Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO), Kanpur, which was appointed as our consultant for providing inputs pertaining to technology and assembling of limbs.

The Kiwanis Club New Delhi has been engaged in its core activity of putting together and providing artificial limbs to physically challenged individuals. On an average, the Centre provides artificial limbs to over 200 patients per month, thus helping them to regain mobility and became self-reliant. The Kiwanis Club has also set up satellite artificial limbs center at Gurugram and Asaf Ali Road in collaboration with Chikitsa.

KCND inaugurated its new upgraded Physiotherapy, Pain Management & Rehabilitation Centre at Kiwanis Bhawan on 16th February 2022 with upgraded machines and new equipment to restore, maintain, and make the most of a patient's mobility, function, and well- being also it helps through physical rehabilitation, injury prevention, and health and fitness. The centre was sponsored by Mr. Sant K Kumar Sanganeria, Past President of KCND.



Cerebral Palsy Centre, established at Kiwanis Bhawan, provides care and treatment for individuals affected by Cerebral Palsy (CP). It is a non-progressive neurological disorder which affects movements, speech, posture and other basic functions.

CP is caused by brain and nervous system damage, sustained before birth, during labour or shortly after childbirth. Depending upon the area and the extent of the damage, symptoms may include spasms, gait abnormalities, seizures and poor muscle tone. Eyesight, hearing, speech and intellect may also be affected. Most of causes of CP do not have specific curative treatment. However, children suffering from CP present many medical problems that can be treated/ prevented.

The initial stage of treatment involves examination by an interdisciplinary team of doctors e.g. Gen. Physician, Physiotherapist, Speech Therapist and Occupational Therapist. Presently the CP Centre at Kiwanis Bhawan attends to an average of 260 cases per month.

Disability Camps in Delhi Collaboration with Delhi Social Welfare Department

As in previous years, KCND has participated in disability camps at various hospitals in collaboration with the Delhi Social Welfare Department. Launched in 2019, this program aims to support individuals with disabilities by offering a range of services in a single location.

Limbs Distribution Camp in Moradabad

The Kiwanis Club of New Delhi took part in an Artificial Limb Distribution Camp held at the Asian Vivekanand Super Specialty Hospital on Kanth Road in Moradabad. This event was organized by the Moradabad Charitable Trust & Health Research Centre. During the camp, the team provided necessary appliances to 55 patients, including 19 prosthesis, 22 orthosis, and 14 mobility aids.

In 2022, we launched a program for the treatment of cerebral palsy called Smile Mudra's Meditation Therapy, with the support of Dr. Pankaj Jain, head of the Smile Meditation Academy and him team member. 



